It also makes sharing photos and albums extremely easy and works just as well on all platforms: iOS, Android, internet and literally everything else with your browser. Finally, it also has a brilliant new selection option that lets you drag your finger and use it like a computer mouse. Quite magically, it also allows you to search for (and actually find) images by simply typing a few words such as animals that will filter all animal images in your photo collection. Magic Google Photos is probably the most excellent app for storing photos in the cloud, but when it comes to the simplicity of your organization, QuickPic is still a way to switch to Android. Its overwhelmingly positive ratings show that simple work: it is a lightweight application with a modern design and connects to online storage servers. Snapseed was acquired by Google a few years ago for good reason: it has an interface that allows you to edit images on your phone very easily using an intuitive swipe-based interface. You have a powerful selective adjustment option, so you can touch a specific point and edit only a certain part of the image, not the whole. Snapseed is ad-free, runs smoothly and is probably the best way to edit photos on Android.VSCO Cam is an application from Visual Supply Company, a company known for developing some of the best video emulation filters for Adobe Lightroom and it's no wonder that this knowledge has resulted in a collection of amazing filters that can be obtained at VSCO Cam. Both have new and modern apps with great visual style and both run very smoothly on Android. GoPro's transition into software territory began with quick video editing apps and it's a great solution that will automatically create immersive video builds that you can easily share. Magisto is another well-known video producer who will add music and effects to your videos and bring them to life. VLC is known as a video player that can easily chew through any kind of format with ease on your desktop, and it is similarly excellent on your mobile phone. After years of testing, the app is out of beta and running solidly. Our previous favorite app, MX Player has been around for years and remains a great video player that we still use. Its swipe-based interface is adapted to touch devices: swipe left and right to move backwards and fast forwards; swipe up or down (on the right side of your device) to adjust the volume, then swipe up or down on the left half to adjust the brightness. Spotify doesn't need an introduction. The \$10 music subscription service allows you to listen to more than 20 million songs unlimited and impossible, a model that comes to replace the current buy-an-album one. You also have Spotify for free, which doesn't require a paid subscription, but introduces ads and restrictions. Sometimes you need to do something as simple as trim part of a song. We found that Lexis Audio Editor does a good job as a wave editor, allowing you to precisely trim and easily export your creations. If you're a djay, chances are you don't rely on your phone, but in case you're on the go or something goes wrong, Android has djay2. The app works great on modern phones (and not so well on slightly older devices), and when it works, it allows for many options: from slowing down and speeding up songs, to some resourceful mixing techniques. If you're into making music and want to create a few beats on the go, Nanoloop is one of our favorite tools for Android. Nanoloop combines a sequencer, synthesizer and sampler in one package, and it is a very minimal but beautifully made tool for creating electronic music. Then, if you're a music professional looking for an app to help you edit more complex projects, you can always rely on Caustic 3 and FL Studio Mobile. These complex apps will work better on a well-powered tablet, where extra screen space is a welcome addition. Signal is a messaging app that allows you to make private calls through both text messages and voice calls. It's free, supports group calls and text messages, and lets you share media. Best of all, it's open source, so make sure that all encryption is done the right way and that the governments' longer hands won't reach your private life. BitDefender Norton Avast Let's explain one thing: if you don't go to some third-party apps or open shady files you don't know anything about, you don't have to worry about Android antivirus apps. The clever sandbox mechanism on which the platform is based makes Android very secure. However, if you have any doubts about your device, these three are the best antivirus apps around. BitDefender comes at a huge price, but it does an excellent job, while Norton is a freemium app that you can explore, and Avast is a nice third option to have. Google Drive is deeply integrated into the Android platform and it's an excellent service. We rarely use cables to transfer files these days: we just sent them to this neat cloud app with 15GB of free storage that would be enough for many people. You can also buy a \$2/monthly plan that gives you 100 GB of storage, or put out \$10 per month for 1 TB of cloud storage. Then you have Dropbox, which also offers an easy-to-use app with a 1TB storage option that costs \$100 a year. It's an equally great choice, and it's up to you to decide which one you like (we stick to Google Drive because of how it integrates with other Google products).
